Modern Bilbao

The impact of the Guggenheim Museum has boosted the city's international profile. In this area of Bilbao, you can discover its most modern and cosmopolitan facet, with innovative constructions and some of the most emblematic museums.



Museums

The Guggenheim Museum of Bilbao is one of the most outstanding cultural projects of the 21st century. Designed by architect Frank Gehry, it is a benchmark for contemporary art and houses works by some of the most influential artists of the second half of the 20th century, including Richard Serra, Jeff Koons, Mark Rothko, Anselm Kiefer, Jenny Holzer, Louise Bourgeois, Eduardo Chillida and Andy Warhol, among others. During the FOK events, the museum presents the exhibitions "Signs and Objects: Pop Art from the Guggenheim Collection" and "Works from the Guggenheim Museum Collection".

Art Inside and Out

Paseo de la Memoria

This area extends along the estuary, between Euskalduna Bilbao, the Guggenheim Museum and Avenida de Abandoibarra. It is an open-air museum-garden that can be toured in about 15 minutes. This area features sculptures by renowned contemporary artists such as Dalí, Chillida, Koons, Bourgeois, Kapoor, and Valdés, among others.



The Estuary and Its Bridges

Exploring the estuary and its bridges means diving into the city's history. While the Zubizuri Bridge and the Pedro Arrupe Footbridge symbolize modern Bilbao, other structures like the San Antón Bridge, La Merced, and the Arenal Bridge represent its historical legacy.

Pintxos Routes

Pintxos are bite-sized appetizers served in bars and taverns throughout the Basque Country.

Casco Viejo

The Casco Viejo, the place that gave birth to the Villa of Bilbao more than 700 years ago, is full of religious and civil buildings with tradition. But also of premises of hospitality. There are more than 200 establishments, some of which are an essential part of the city's pintxo routes. There is not just one area, but many: Plaza Nueva, Santa María, Somera, Unamuno, Jardines, Los Cantones... The important thing is that tradition and modernity are part of this proposal for all audiences.

Diputación

Perpendicular to the Gran Vía, this small street is one of the hearts of the pintxo routes due to its proximity to the commercial and cultural centers. Its pedestrian character contributes to this, inviting visitors to stop at the locals and their terraces to taste from the most classic morsels (ham and tortilla) to the most innovative (true haute cuisine in miniature) at any time of day.

Ledesma

Parallel to the main commercial artery of the city (the Gran Vía), Ledesma Street has many places to have a bite to eat. Its geographical location, close to both museums and the most commercial streets or the old part of the city, make it an unavoidable place to visit. In addition, it is pedestrian.

Guggenheim Space

The area around the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao has become an obligatory stop thanks to the attractions of the new urban area of Abandoibarra. A residential area par excellence, this part of the city has been able to adapt to the changes with places that combine tourist attractions with Bilbao tradition. The important thing, in any case, is that the streets of the Ensanche (Heros, Lersundi, Iparraguirre, Henao, Mazarredo, Máximo Aguirre...) have excellent pintxo bars to enjoy the ephemeral art of the small bite.



Urban Bilbao

The Ensanche of Bilbao boasts the bourgeois elegance of the buildings surrounding the Plaza Moyúa, the central point of the city up to the Sagrado Corazón. In this area we also find the Gran Vía de Don Diego López de Haro, the main artery of Bilbao, named after the founder of the Villa. In its layout is a large part of the commercial center.



Just five minutes from Plaza Moyúa we can find the Azkuna Zentroa Alhondiga Bilbao, a former wine and liquor warehouse of the twentieth century now converted into a socio-cultural center. Its classical exterior contrasts with the original interior design by the well-known industrial designer Philippe Stark.





- **Artxanda Funicular**: A cable train that provides a panoramic view of Bilbao.

- **Sunday market in El Arenal:** in the Arenal area, near the estuary, every Sunday morning there are flower and money exchange stalls. It is a meeting point for local people.
